FASH 'Chat'"Folk Dancing is New Craze in Eastleigh"

This headline was from the 'Eastleigh Weekly News' and referred to Eastleigh Folk Dance Club who met for the first time on Monday 17th March 1975.

Eastleigh Folk Dance Club was started by Syd and Joyce Wilkins and Joy Simmons in 1975, after discussions over the hedge between their two houses. Two initial sessions were held at Eastleigh Baptist Church Hall in March and May 1975.

As there was sufficient interest, the club started monthly ceilidhs in September of the same year. Joyce was our first Treasurer. After a few years, Syd took over and served in the role until 2014, when ill-health caused him to resign. Joy Simmons has been Secretary throughout and over the years has booked many different callers, often giving new callers an opportunity to call their first dances with a live band and dancers.

We have danced at Centre 66 in Eastleigh but voted with our feet when they double-booked us twice, and went back to the Baptist Church Hall. Dancing on carpet is not ideal so we then looked for a new home and found it at Railway Institute, opposite Sainsburys in Romsey Road, Eastleigh. The building is now owned by the Junction Church, but fortunately we have been able to stay in the same venue which has a spacious wooden dance floor, and a large stage which is often full of musicians!

Eastleigh Folk Dance Club have always been fortunate to have a live band, initially led by Rollo Woods, later by Arthur Tooley and then by Stuart Martyn We usually have at least 6 musicians playing for our club nights, often more.

Like most dance clubs in the area, Eastleigh Folk Dance Club has had its ups and downs. Joy recalls that the maximum number of dancers was 77 and the minimum number was when we restarted after Covid, where we had 3 dancers and 2 musicians per dancer!

We would like to say a big "Thank You" to all the callers, musicians and, of course, dancers who have supported Eastleigh Folk Dance Club over the last 50 years. We are celebrating our 50th Birthday on Monday 10th March, when Joy Simmons will be calling many of the dances which were called on the first ever Eastleigh Folk Dance Club night in 1975.

Again from the Eastleigh Weekly News - "People who had never heard of the 'Virginia Reel', 'Cumberland Square Eight' or 'Circle Waltz' were soon joining in and quickly mastering the figures."

If you would like to 'master these figures' and other dances, come along on 24th February, 10th March or other Eastleigh Folk Dance dates which are listed in the FASH diary.

When Eastleigh FDC was founded, 'Solent Waves' did not exist, and I can only assume

there there was a mention of the new club in the previous publication, the 'SOFA newssheet', copies of which, sadly, I do not have. Eastleigh FDC's ceilidhs on the 11th July and the 12th September were certainly included on page 3 of the very first issue of 'Solent Waves'.

In fact, Eastleigh FDC was the only club regularly included in the 'District Programme' in those early editions of 'Solent Waves', but their events included not just celidhs; Playford dance, Scottish dance and Running set all featured. Some evenings were noted as

workshops, often led by David Williams. Joy was first specifically mentioned as a caller in the November 1977 issue, although the editors omitted her name, only printing 'JS'; JS was properly identified as Joy Simmons in the December copy. 50 years of calling!

Note that Eastleigh FDC is not the only dance group in our area which has been running for 50 years; Solent Folk Dance Club, based on the outskirts of Havant and led these days by Sue Bradshaw, celebrated their 50th anniversary in the autumn of 2023.





Earlier in the year, Wemsfest announced a couple of new venues they will use. These are the Havana Bar in Little London, Chichester (described as beautiful, brick-vaulted and atmospheric) and The Old Orchard (Southbourne Village Hall) in First Avenue, PO10 8HN. The first concert of particular interest in the folk area is Gnoss, on the 2nd May in Southbourne. Tickets available in the usual way via the website and a link to 'wegottickets' or in person at 'Bookends' or 'Harbour Records' in Emsworth.. Note also

that Wemsfest have changed their e-mail address. Sadly we hear of another loss to our local 'world of folk'; Ken Stephens died earlier this year. Paul Clarke of Focsle Music wrote:

"We're saddened by the quiet passing of Ken Stephens, singer, songwriter, concertina-player, yarn-spinner, MC and general cheerleader for the folk scene. If not a founding member of The Fo'c'sle Folk Club, he was certainly an early adopter, and supported it on and off for at least 60 years.

He was known all over the country, mainly at shanty festivals, and drove considerable distances, even in his 80s, to attend events, often ones with little expectation of big audiences: he just seemed to love communicating by song. Musical collaborators include Cyril Tawney, Sophie Wright, Johnny Coppin and Pete Watkinson, as well as duo partner Fiona Murfitt (Wyndwytch). Some of these groupings had followings in Europe and the USA.

Ken was a keen supporter of FOCSLE Music's "Live on the Lawn" strand, including hosting one event, and (in the immediate aftermath of the Pandemic, when our venue was still unavailable) floated the bizarre, though unrealized, idea of meeting on a local station concourse (enclosed, and not as impossibly noisy as you'd imagine), an enthusiasm backed up with sourcing the venue and an offer to finance the initial meets.

Ken, for a long time not a well man, had had a fall at home in early November, then a series of misfortunes in hospital, including most recently, a fall there. He died in his sleep overnight Thursday/Friday 16th/17th January. As one who abhorred unnecessary "fuss", he had requested no formal funeral; a long-time musical sidekick, Geoff Payne, will be fixing some singing-based memorial event in due course."

My thanks to Paul for letting me reprint his words. My own memories of Ken were as a melodeon player who would occasionally, when he was not shooting off somewhere fairly distant, play for our Morris dancing.

Finally a reminder that this month we have two FASH workshops: the first our (now) annual gettogether with 'The Madding Crowd' to perform West Gallery Music, and the second, a dance workshop with Frances Oates with the intriguing title "What happens next?" To find out what does come next, join us at Soberton on the 23rd. Frances is supported with music from Pete and Sue Hall.
