FASH 'Chat' – 2025 - The Madding Crowd's Golden Jubilee Year!

It is well known that this year is the 250th Anniversary of Jane Austen's birth and The Madding Crowd will be part of that celebration, of which more later. However, more important to many of us is the fact that this year we are celebrating 50 years of The Madding Crowd! We are hosting a singing and playing day on Saturday 28th June in St. Boniface Church, Chandlers Ford, where we have our weekly rehearsals. If you would like to join us, details and a booking form are on our website *The Madding Crowd*.

In the summer of 1975 an advertisement appeared for 'An unusual and pleasurable evening - A Victorian Village Evensong with Church Band'. This event was held on the 6th July at St Barnabas' Church, Swanmore, and was followed by a ceilidh at the Church School. The music was based on research into the period 1830 to 1870 by Rollo Woods, whom some of you may remember from the Black Glove Band, Eastleigh Folk Dance Club or the Winchester Morris Men. The band and choir enjoyed themselves so much that they started getting together regularly to sing and play what became known as West Gallery music. By 1979 the name The Madding Crowd had been formally adopted and Mike Bailey had become its Musical Director.

Word spread about this music, a part of our heritage that was being lost, and many people believed it should be played and sung again before it disappeared completely. Researchers made contact and collaborated, searched in local and national archives and found manuscripts at jumble sales and in unexpected places – such as propping up the leg of an organ stool! Thanks to our own enthusiastic researchers and friends in the *West Gallery Music Association*, The Madding Crowd's repertoire has increased over the 50 years to more than 1,000 pieces of music from the Georgian and early Victorian period. As well as the music, we now have a wealth of information about composers who might otherwise have been forgotten and about the village history of the many venues where we have performed.

We have much to celebrate as well as the concerts and numerous performances at Heritage events, but I'll just pick out three things – 14 consecutive years of the annual FASH workshop, 27 years of the Madding Crowd House Party held at Halsway Manor for musicians and singers from all over the country and, last but not least, having successfully kept everything going on Zoom right through the Covid years! All these things rely above all on the hard work and dedication of Mike and Charlotte Bailey, who have been a constant for nearly all of our 50 successful years.

Now back to Jane Austen.... on Sunday 6th July at around 3pm The Madding Crowd will perform a short Jane Austen-themed concert as part of a *Regency Country Fair* being held in Pump Field, Steventon, Hampshire, the site of Jane Austen's birthplace. We chose most of the music because it is also found in the Austen family collections. Jane had even copied out

some of the pieces herself. Also performing will be the Hampshire Regency Dancers, Garston Gallopers, Alton Morris, Mayfly Morris and local school children demonstrating Maypole dancing. There will be talks and book signings from historian, author and TV presenter Lucy Worsley and a Q&A with Pride & Prejudice actor Adrian Lukis, aka Mr Wickham. N.B. entry to the fair is by ticket only. More information about this and Steventon's other Jane Austen anniversary events is *here*.

Good to know there are still things we can celebrate in these very 'interesting' times!

An item not included in our dance dairy as there is relatively little information on it: on the 1st June Friends of English Dance are running an Afternoon of Dance at The Jurgens Centre, Englefield Green, Egham, TW20 0QR (the same location as the regular Sunday Afternoon Contra Dances). Starting at 2.30, the dance will be led by

Brooke Friendly with musicians 'Box of Frogs' (Linda Game and Ali Messer) and will finish at 5.30. Brooke will have just finished a series of workshops and dances at the Chippenham Folk Festival, and FED have seized the opportunity for her to call at one of their events before she returns to the United States. Ticket prices are £15 for the afternoon, £13 for members of FED. There is no mention of how to pay, so it might be worth taking cash to pay on the door.

Friends of English Dance are building a directory to replace, in effect, the one which Chris Turner ran under the umbrella of the 'Set and Turn Single' organisation. I note that the number of dance clubs and organisations like FASH included in the directory is slowly growing, also the list of dance callers and musicians/bands. If you belong to a dance club which is not included, or are a musician or caller, do consider adding the names and contact details to the directory. You will need to register to add a listing, but there is no charge. Their website can be found at https://friendsofenglishdance.org.uk/.

The continued very dry spell may be causing problems to the gardeners among us, but it had the advantage that the sports field at Evesham's De Montfort School was dry enough to be used for parking caravans and motorhomes/campervans both at the recent May Heydays festival and earlier, over Easter, the Camping and Caravan Club's Weekend organised by the Wessex section of their Folk Dance and Song Group.

Having attended May Heydays, I thought it went very well; we thoroughly enjoyed it. As well as the English and American dance sessions and workshops, the organisers have retained an International dance section to continue the tradition inherited the Eastbourne from International Festival. "International" this year included a couple of French workshops with Peter Clifton, who also led two Eurobals; there were two Scandi workshops and two Argentine Tango sessions. Also added were a couple of storytelling workshops led by Daisy Black, singing events and even African drumming and singing sessions. I have to admit, I did not attend Mike Courthold's 'Heavy Metal Contra' evening.

Inevitably there were one or two niggles in the smooth running of things; probably the most serious was the non-appearance of the food van on Monday lunchtime. Sadly, catering at May Heydays does not always seem to run quite as smoothly as it might.

Much of the 2026 May Heydays has already been arranged with quite a few bands and callers already confirmed. The dates will be the 1st to the 4th of May and flyers are already available. However, Mecki Testroet, festival director, warned that Monty Crook, who has always done a huge amount of behind the scenes work, is proposing to retire. She believes that if three, maybe even four, volunteers come forward to take over all that he did, then the 2027 festival will run. Otherwise it will not. So.... if you believe you could help, and it seems unlikely you would need to live in the Evesham area, contact Mecki as soon as possible via the contact details on the website https://mayheydays.org.uk/.

So, what next for dancers? The Chippenham Folk Festival will have been on the bank holiday weekend of May, then the first full weekend in June will be the annual Stonesfield Dance Weekend, a few miles from Woodstock. Two weeks later the Lichfield Folk Dance Festival takes place, which this year includes a Regency evening dance.

Our dance diary is starting to shrink as we approach the summer, with a couple of the clubs which meet weekly or twice monthly stopping in June and another couple closing for the break in July. The folk clubs and arts centres are still fairly active at the moment, but as usual, few will meet in August.

A couple of festivals to mention: while not as big as the festival in Salisbury used to be, there is a small one day festival this year, to be held for the second year in the grounds of The Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum (58 The Close, SP1 2EX.) on the 7th June. Details can be found on the website www.thewardrobe.org.uk/whats-on/folk-festival. Tickets are £12 adult and £6 for a junior, available via the website.

The following day, in the same location, although curiously not included on the Museum's website, there is a Salisbury Family Folk Festival, aimed particularly at younger people and their families. Details can be found on the Festival Facebook page, or on the FASH website. Tickets are available from Emily Askew on em_askew@yahoo.co.uk.

Waterlooville is holding a music festival from the 11th to the 14th June; folk music will feature on the Friday evening which is their 'Folk and Ale Night' with Magpie Lane. The event will take place at St George's Church, and tickets are available via the website cont. on p 9

Interestingly, according to our archives, from the late '70s to the mid-90s Waterlooville held an annual 'Folklore' event. It started out as a weekend festival with displays, music and dance, but later became a "Folk Day" with a ceilidh in the precinct in the daytime and another in the Community Centre in the evening. Sadly, there seems to be little record of it after 1997.

The display sides diary is much longer as several sides have published their programmes since our last issue of 'Solent Waves'. I can find no published information for a few sides, and where there are just one or two entries for this month in the diary above, it is usually because I have
